K

The letter K is the 11th letter of the English alphabet and one of the most (0) in terms of sound and symbolism. Its hard, percussive pronunciation (1) it a sense of strength and sharpness, and because of this, it is often a favourite in branding, linguistics, and even pop culture.

K traces its roots (2) to the Phoenician letter *kaph*, which later evolved into the Greek *kappa*. The Romans adopted it into the Latin alphabet, though it was used less (3) than C, which often took over its role in Latin-derived words. Despite this, K has remained an (4) letter in many languages.

Though not as common as some letters, K appears in many impactful words like king, knowledge, kindness, and key. It is often silent, particularly in words of Germanic (5), such as knight, knee, and know. This silent K adds a layer of linguistic complexity, as its presence is evidence of older pronunciations that have since disappeared.

K is **(6)** with boldness and energy, which is why many brands and fictional characters use it—think of Kellogg's, Kodak, and Mortal Kombat. It also plays a role in internet slang, where "K" is often used as a short, sometimes **(7)**, response to messages.

From language to branding and science, K is a letter of impact and efficiency. Despite being less common than some letters, it continues to leave a (8) impression wherever it appears.
